
In accordance with Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) regulations at 29 CFR Part 1614, revised September 24, 2012, this serves as notification that the agency's investigation into the accepted claims of your client's EEO complaint has not been completed within the 180 day time requirement. We estimate that the investigation will be completed no later than July 1, 2013.

However, should your client not want to wait until the agency completes the investigation and issues your client's copy of the investigative report, you have the right to request a hearing before an EEOC Administrative Judge or file a civil action in an appropriate United States District Court.

Should your client choose to request an EEOC hearing at this time, you must request a hearing directly from the EEOC field office that has jurisdiction over the geographic area in which your client's complaint arose, namely, the Washington Field Office, 131 M Street, NE, Fourth Floor, Suite 4NW02F, Washington, DC 20507-0100.
