She has extensive experience advocating on behalf of LGBTQ+ individuals in impact litigation and immigration matters, and also represented tenants subjected to unlawful racial discrimination in a lawsuit against a municipality, resulting in a favorable settlement. While working in-house, Kara continued to work on pro bono projects, including advocating on behalf of incarcerated individuals subjected to solitary confinement, as well as people impacted by police misconduct.
