At the Department of Commerce, he was the primary staff-level attorney for all efforts related to artificial intelligence security. He also led the development of environmental permitting strategies for the department's investments in semiconductor manufacturing. Elias has also served as an adjunct staff member at the RAND Corporation's Technology and Security Policy Center. He has extensive experience in other areas of law that are essential to the technology sector. These include patent, copyright and antitrust law.

Elias clerked for Judge Lucy Koh of the US Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit and Judge Richard Taranto of the US Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit.
